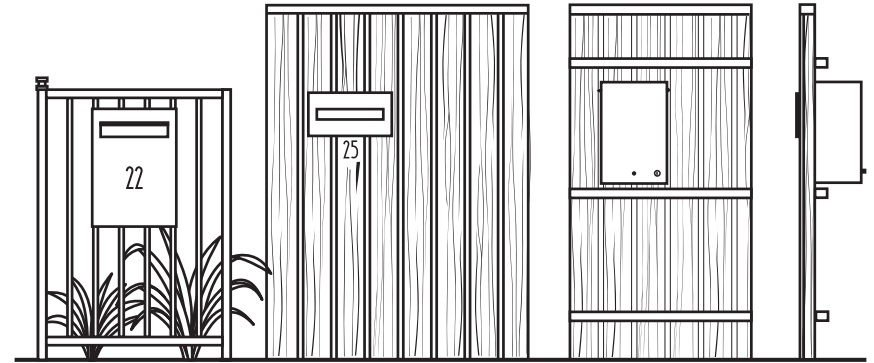

For the best results we recommend using a qualified builder or professional installer.



Timber and Pool Fence Installation

1. The letterbox has pre-drilled holes to make attachment to your fence easy. Check the location of the holes against your fence to find the best position. NZ post recommends the posting slot be 900mm to 1200mm from the ground.
2. Mark and pre-drill the fixing points and cut a hole in your fence to suit the posting slot.
3. Use the supplied fixings to attach the catcher to your fence using a square drive bit or screwdriver.
4. For additional weather-proofing – add a line of silicone to the join where the top of the letterbox meets the fence.
5. Glue or rivet the faceplate to the front of your fence. A flexible glue such as MS adhesive is ideal for timber fences. A particular type of glue may be required to suit your specific fence material. Four black rivets are supplied with the XL faceplate.
6. Remove the protective film from the stainless-steel faceplate to finish.

Cleaning and Care

We recommend cleaning your letterbox regularly with warm soapy water.

To remove any stubborn marks, use a soft cloth and methylated spirits.

If the lock is left unused for some time, spray a lubricant like WD40 or CRC down the lock barrel, then push your letterbox key in and out of the lock several times.
